Project Summary:

The regulatory phase of major projects is complex and requires detailed analysis and strategies to ensure completion. DIAND asked Integrated Environments to lead a skilled team to review their regulatory responsibilities with respect to the Mackenzie Gas Project and the Crown duty to consult. This Report reviews the overall MGP project context and project approval requirements, the case law around the Crown's duty to consult, Treaties and known asserted claims, and best practices to provide a preliminary assessment of DIAND MGP related aboriginal consultation responsibilities, and related issues, gaps and risks.
